## Scope of Works

Ringway provide infrastructure services nationwide and are private sector partners, who are dedicated to delivering public services. They focus on being local partners, developing sustainable highways and transportation, in the hope of providing solutions that strengthen communities they work within.

Together with their associated companies, Ringway teams are responsible for looking after over 50,000 kms of the UK's highways network, where they deliver specialist highway services across the largest highways maintenance portfolio within the UK. Go Green have been working with Ringway since 2016 and providing services like skips and bin services, muckaway, emergency clearances (from road traffic accidents), aggregate deliveries and tipping on account. Go Green have been working with Highway England East, via Ringway since 2019.

## Challenges

Highways England East work closely with Ringway, and had asked them to problem solve the build-up of animal carcasses that were occurring up and down the A47. Ringway approached their Go Green Account Managers to discuss the problem they were having and developed a strategy to both tackle the current build up

As part of the plan to clear the increase, Go Green reached out to our supply chain and arranged for one of our suppliers to complete night work (out of hours) to make the carcass collections, on behalf of Ringway and Highways England East. These collections took place over a 2 and half week period, 5 nights per week; Go Green's allocated supplier drove up and down the A47, collecting the carcasses for disposal.

## Outcome

At the end of the 2.5 week period, we were required to remove 161 carcasses in total to resolve the build-up. This same service was provided by Go Green for Ringway in 2021 but the collections only consisted of night work over a couple of days as opposed to night work over a few weeks.

As part of the service, Go Green send Ringway a Kill Data report, inclusive of the below information:

- Route taken
- Direction
- Type of animal
- Between which junctions
- Date of collection

As the carcass collections are part of a natural occurrence, the occurrence of this issue is never fully resolved, however Go Green are available 24/7 to Ringway, on behalf of Highways England East to solve any further carcass build ups.
